## **SHOW REGULATIONS**

1. Lines in the margins indicate changes to the wording in last year's schedule.
2. Entries must be made on a current entry form (see last page of this schedule). Please submit your entry form in good time and see Regulation 4 below. Please place your entry card with your exhibit(s) as you stage it/them.
3. No Exhibitor may enter more than three exhibits per class. Applies to all classes APART FROM the classes for young people. In this class there is no limit on the number of entries per Exhibitor.
4. Doors open 7.30 a.m. Exhibits to be staged by 9.45 a.m. on Show morning. Especially distributed and grown entries may be brought to the Show Secretary (or another Committee member) or brought to the Village Hall during Friday evening, between 7:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Collection may be arranged. Please contact the Show Secretary for further information.
5. As a courtesy to other Exhibitors, please stage in plenty of time. Exhibitors should leave the Hall as soon as they have staged their exhibits. Any Exhibitor remaining in the Hall after 9.45 a.m. may be disqualified.
6. Once the entry form has been submitted, changes to that form will only be made at the discretion of the Show Secretaries). UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL ENTRIES BE ACCEPTED AFTER 9.30 a.m. ON SHOW MORNING.
7. Exhibits that are already staged are moved ONLY at the discretion of the Show Secretaries.
8. Muddy exhibits may be refused entry.
9. We can provide small and medium sized vases. However, for larger exhibits or 'top heavy' subjects, e.g. dahlias, delphiniums, Exhibitors should please provide their own containers.
10. Exhibits remain the property of the Exhibitor.
11. The Show shall be open to the public from 2.00 p.m., and will close at approximately 4.00 p.m., whereupon the presentation of trophies and the raffle will take place.
12. Prize monies shall be paid out at the close of the Show. Any money not collected at this time will be forfeited.
13. If, in the opinion of the Judge(s), none of the exhibits merits a particular award, then that award shall not be made.

14. The trophies awarded shall be kept in good condition and returned to the Trophy Secretary during August 2018. Winners of the trophies on the day of the Show will leave the trophies for the purpose of engraving.

15. The CARNILL CUP shall be presented to the Exhibitor who gains the most points in the Show.

16. Exhibits must be the work of amateurs and must be the work or produce of an individual Exhibitor.

17. Where the exhibit is a potted plant, it must have been in the possession of the Exhibitor for a period exceeding six months.

18. The Society's rules for judging the horticultural classes are based on the recommendations of the Royal Horticultural Society.

19. The award of trophies shall be based on the number of points achieved by each Exhibitor.

20. The decision of the Judges shall be final.

21. Where there is a tie for points for a particular award, then the Exhibitor having the most First Prizes shall be the winner.

22. The organisers cannot accept any responsibility for the loss or damage of exhibits, containers etc., but undertake to exercise every reasonable care.

23. The Show will be an Open Show, that is, entry is not conditional on being a Member of the Woodborough Horticultural Society.

This class is a replacement for the Floral Art section and exhibits are not judged on the basis of artistic merit: they may be completely relaxed and informal in style.

### **SPECIAL CLASS**

Members of Committee were given Dahlia tubers back in March. They have grown them on for this show and will present a suitable number of blooms in a vase. The varieties are all mainly red, to celebrate the Ruby anniversary of Woodborough Horticultural Society. The best exhibit will be selected by votes cast by visitors to the Show on the afternoon.

### Class:

52. A jar of redcurrant jelly.
53. A red jam, made using a soft fruit such as strawberry or raspberry (but not a stone fruit such as plum). Please label your jar with the type of fruit and the date you made the jam.
54. A jar of any relish based on red peppers. Please label your jar with the type of any additional fruit or vegetable you have used and the date you made the relish.
55. A focaccia loaf containing tomatoes (not made in a bread maker).
56. Three Cherry Bakewells, presented on a plate.
57. A red onion tart.
58. Red Velvet cupcakes. Please use this recipe, which makes about 12 cupcakes, and show FIVE:

**CUPCAKES:** 100g (4oz) butter, softened, 150g (5oz) caster sugar, 125g (4½ oz) self-raising flour, 25g (1oz) cocoa powder, sifted, plus extra for dusting, 2 large eggs, 2 tablespoons milk, 10ml (⅓ fl oz) red natural food-colouring gel (gel or paste work better than red food colouring))

**FOR THE FROSTING:** 50g (2oz) butter, softened, 200g (7oz) full-fat cream cheese, 300g (11oz) icing sugar, sifted, ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

1 You will need a 12-hole muffin tin and a piping bag fitted with a star nozzle (optional). Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and line the tin with paper cases.

2 Measure all the cupcake ingredients into a large bowl and mix together until smooth, either by hand or using an electric hand whisk or food mixer. Spoon the batter into the paper cases, dividing it evenly among them.

3 Bake in the oven for 20-25 minutes until well risen and springy to the touch. Remove the cupcakes from the tin and leave to cool on a wire rack.

4 To make the frosting, measure all the ingredients into a food processor and whiz until smooth, or beat together by hand. Fill the piping bag (if using) with the frosting and pipe on to the cooled cupcakes. Alternatively, add the frosting to the cakes using a teaspoon, spreading it over the top of each cupcake. Dust with cocoa powder to serve.
